ORDER DIRECTING THE PROVINCE TREASURER TO PAY 48/4 TO WIL-LIAM KING.

A Petition of William King of Sheffield, setting forth that he Legislative was a Soldier in both the Crown point Expeditions in 1755. and Econocil, xxii., 1756. whereby he was intitled to half pay during the intermediate 44. Mass. space, but that he was not made up in the Muster Roll for the same; ixxvii., iie. And praying Relief.

Read and

Ordered That the Treasurer pay to Capt Ithamar Hubbell for Laws, xv., 456, the Use of the Pet the sum of forty eight Shillings & four pence in full of ye half pay he was entitled to on his reinlisting into ye service on ye last Crown point Expedition, the same being omitted in Col^o Dwights Muster Roll notwithstanding. [Passed June 11.

CHAPTER 60.

ORDER IMPOWERING JOS. WHETCOMB, GUARDIAN, TO SELL REAL ESTATE AND MAKING PROVISION IN REGARD TO THE PROCEEDS.

A Petition of Joseph Whetcomb Guardian, and of Susanna Legislative Whetcomb Mother of Anna Whetcomb, daughter of John Whet-Records of the Council, xxii., comb of Lancaster deceased, setting forth, that the Said Anna is 45. Mass. Sole Heir to her deceased Father, who died seized of Fifty Six Archives, xix., Acres of Land in Lancaster with some unfinished Buildings thereon, House Jour. and that there is no Estate (except the Land be sold) wherewith to nal. pp. 54, 58, Province finish the same and that without there are Some Disbursements on Laws, ii., 151, the Buildings they will go to decay; and that the whole rents for chap. 10. no more at present than Forty shillings & Annum; Therefore praying liberty to sell the same for the benefit of the said Anna.

Read and

Ordered that the Prayer of the Petition be granted; and that the Petitioner be and hereby is impowered in his said Capacity as Guardian to make Sale of the said Deceased's Real Estate for the most it will fetch; and to make and execute a good Deed or Deeds thereof, he observing the Law of this Province respecting the Sale of Real Estates by Executors and Administrators; Provided sufficient Caution be given to the Judge [of] 'Probate for the County of Worcester that the Proceeds of said sale shall be secured and applied to the Benefit and Advantage of the lawful Heir or Heirs, reserving to the Widow of the Deceased only the annual Income of one third Part thereof in Lieu of her Right of Dower in the Premises, during her natural Life; and at her Decease to be disposed of as the Law directs. [Passed June 11.]
