Ms. Murphy said that the town had been given information that there had been 10 African-American soldiers from New Milford—Prince Crosley/Crosbee, Jesse Gratis, Prince Gratis, SIP/SFP Hubbell, Thaddeus Jacklin, Jeruel Phillips, Samuel Phillips/Philips, Shem, Mingo Treat/Treet/Treet, and Javan Wilson—who fought in the Revolutionary War. The Town Council went on record to recognize these soldiers for their service.
