

Algernon Sidney Hubbell, one of the oldest members of the bar of New Jersey, died at his home in Newark at midnight on Monday of bronchial trouble. He was born in Danvers, N. H.

Mass., on Nov. 23, 1799, in the bosom of his grandfather. His father, Walter Hubbell, fought at the battle of Bunker's Hill, and was afterward a State Senator of Massachusetts and a Judge of the County Courts. Mr. A. B. Hubbell was a wonderfully well-preserved man. He attended to the business of his office until within a week of his death. He leaves four children, Mrs. Treat, wife of the Rev. Charles Treat of this city, and Miss Eliza, George W., and John J. Hubbell, all of Newark. The funeral will be held to-morrow at 10 o'clock from 25 East Kinney street.
