In 1884, Fredrikke Schjödt married Arthur Hubbell Palmer (1859–1918), an American professor, in Oslo, and moved with him to Cleveland, Ohio. They later lived in New Haven, Connecticut. They had two sons, Harold (1890–1959), a geologist at the University of Hawaii, and Erik (1885-1957), a mathematics professor. In widowhood she moved to Honolulu, Hawaii, where she died in 1947, aged 86 years

Harold Schjöth Palmer was born in Cleveland, Ohio, June 4, 1890.

Arthur Hubbell Palmer, his father, was born June 30, 1859, in Cleveland. He graduated from Western Reserve, 1879, holds the degree of M.A. and is professor of the German language and literature in Yale University. Mrs. Palmer's maiden name was Frederikke Marie Schjöth. E. S. Palmer, '06S, is a brother.

Palmer prepared at New Haven High School and Hopkins Grammar. He took a Dissertation appointment, contributed to Yale Alumni Weekly and sang in the college choir. He was on the Freshman and University Swimming Teams, winning the 220-yard intercollegiate swimming championship 1910. Beta Theta Pi. Sigma Xi. The first three years he roomed with Nettleton, '11L in 198 and 215 Farnam; in Senior year with Bensinger in 107 Welch.
