Elbert Edwards Hubbell (ME# 2432) was born in Trumbull CT in 1817. His parents moved to Bridgeport when he was one year old. In 1834, he began working for his uncles J & GE Hubbell in their grocery store. After a few years he established a business with his father manufacturing saddle-trees and selling groceries at the retail level. In 1848, he and Sherwood Sterling established a wholesale grocery house under the firm name of EE Hubbell & Co. Sterling stayed with the business for 17 years where thereafter EE's brother George took over. After the death of George in 1877, the firm name changed to EE Hubbell & Son when EE's eldest son Charles came on. In 1880, EE's youngest son Howard came on and the firm became EE Hubbell & Sons.
