About thirty acres of land on the hillside, above Hope Cemetery, to be known as Hope Cemetery Annex, have been purchased by the Cemetery Association. The Annex is in the town of Corning. The cornerstone of the new Grace Methodist Church was laid Thursday afternoon, April 14, 1898, by Presiding **Elder H. H. Hubbell May 4, 1898.** " Amaziah S. Kendall, aged 72 years, since 1860 a resident of Corning, died following an illness of four weeks. He began the practice of law at Jasper in 1852. He specialized as a counselor and for many years was a partner of George B. Bradley. The city water system was during the Summer extended to the Northside section of the city.
