 bound to the Governor and Company of his Majesties english Colony of
 Connecticut in the full and just sum of one Thousand Pounds Lawful
 Money of said Colony to be paid to the said Governor and Company to
 which Payment well and truly to be made and done we the said
 Samuel Hubbel & Samuel Elmer Do bind
 ourselves and Heirs Executors and Administrators severally and
 severally firmly by these Presents sealed with our seals Dated at
 Hartford this 12th Day of January Anno Domini 1759

The Condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the said
 Samuel Hubbel — is and has undertaken to act as
 Paymaster for a certain Company of Foot Soldiers lately viz in the
 last Campaign against the French Possessions in Canada
 Commanded by him the said Samuel Hubbel
 Now if the said Samuel Hubbel Paymaster as above said shall
 faithfully and truly perform and discharge his said Trust and Office
 and without all unnecessary or unreasonable Delay well and truly
 pay and render to the several Officers and Soldiers of said Compa-
 ny all such sum or sums of Money as on the Settlement of their
 accounts shall appear due and payable to them respectively
 and as he shall have orders from the Payable to receive out of the
 publick Treasury of said Colony making only such necessary
 Allowances and Deductions for Arms not returned or accounted for
 as on due Enquiry shall be found just and reasonable then and
 in such Case said bond is to become null and void otherwise to
 remain in full Force and Virtue in the Law
