

Document dated 13 January 1776: O. Ellsworth and T. Seymour signed this document to have William G. Hubbell pay Ebenezer Tuttle £1 16 shillings for caring for a sick soldier. Ellsworth and Seymour served on Connecticut's Committee of the Pay Table during the American Revolutionary War and were two of the five men who supervised Connecticut's war expenditures. The Pay Table's members were rotated. The signatures of three of the members of the Pay Table were required for an order to pay.

Captain William Gaylord Hubbell (ME# 226) commanded the 7<sup>th</sup> Connecticut Regiment in 1775 and the third Company of the 16 Connecticut Regiment of Militia in 1776. (See Military History for further details)
