From Santa Fe.

St. Louis, March 31.—Santa Fe dates to the 28th ult. have been received here. Indian depredations were on the increase. Several skirmishes had occurred between the Mexican Indians, and a number were killed of both parties. It was reported that Judge Hopper, James Lucas, and two other Americans had been killed near El Paso. Also, that James Hubble, who had gone to Sonora to buy mules, had been killed by the government parties.

A letter from Santa Cruz river, dated February 3d, says that if the people of Sonors had encouragement they would declare themselves independent of Mexico and ask to be annexed to the United States. The country was overrun with Indians, robbing and murdering the people in every direction. The revolution in Sonora had ceased and a new governor had been appointed.
