

## MORE TROOPS FOR THE WAR.

The following is from the *Ohio State Journal* of yesterday:

We understand that General McClellan has given an order that companies to form nine regiments shall be mustered into the United States service for the war. Lieutenant Pesse would recommence mustering by companies yesterday. He has also received orders from the War Department to discharge all three months' volunteers under his command, and fill their places in companies with three years' troops. The discharges will commence at once.
