48th Va. Regt. It becomes my painful duty to record the death of WM. J. C. HUBBLE, son of R. T. and

Sophia Hubble, of Smyth county, in the 20th year of his age. He was killed in the second days fight at Gettysburg. He was a member of Co. E, 50th Va. Regt. He was a youth of kindly disposition to all, but especially so to an afflicted father, after whose death, tho' not 16 years old, his greatest concern was to provide for a widowed mother and six small children younger than himself. In August, 1861, having arrived at the age of 18, he volunteered to defend his country's rights. He was a brave and faithful soldier, always at the post of duty up to the time of his death. He had, by his kind and manly disposition, gained the esteem of his company and all who knew him. So falls the young, the brave and the good. At the residence of Rev. Jas.
