WASHINGTON, July 1.—Gen. Grillet has been ordered to California to take the position vacated by Gen. McDowell.

The Committee on Ways and Means have agreed to report a small tariff bill—probably to-morrow. It covers the manufactures of iron, the value of which principally depends on the labor employed upon them.

The following order has just been promulgated from the War Department:

General Order No. 28:

By direction of the President of the United States the following orders are made:

2. Brevet Maj.-Gen. Alven C. Gillem is assigned to the command of the Fourth Military District, and will assume command without delay.
