

MINERS' RESOLUTIONS.

The Frontenac Miners Express Themselves Very Strongly on the Disaster.

PITTSBURG, Kan., Nov. 14.—Fifteen hundred miners met in convention here to-day, to present resolutions of grievances as follows:

Whereas, We, the miners of this district, deeply deplore the great calamity that has happened in our midst, and while we extend our heartfelt sympathy to the widows and orphans, we condemn the action of the state mine inspector, G. W. Findlay, in not looking better after the ventilation of mines. Therefore be it

Resolved, That we respectfully call upon the governor of this state for his immediate removal, and that a practical miner be appointed in his place.

Resolved, That we shall commence work at 7 o'clock a. m., take one-half hour for dinner and quit work at 4:30 p. m., and all men to be on top at 5 o'clock p. m.

Resolved, That the company engage competent men to fire the shots, and that hereafter no man to be allowed to fire his own shot, and no firing allowed to commence until all men are out of the pit.

Resolved, That a reserve of shot firers be kept by the company, so that in case of one disability green hands be not allowed to fire shots; that the pit committee shall indorse and judge of the competency or incompetency of the shot firers.

Resolved, That all cross-cuts shall not be more than forty feet from center to center, and all back cross-cuts be made air tight by the company, and district prices be paid for all cross-cuts.

Resolved, That the miners choose two practical miners, the Cherokee and Pittsburg Coal and Mining company choose two, the four to choose a fifth, to inquire into and investigate the cause of the Frontenac disaster, to give a fair and impartial account of the same; also, that the miners choose one practical mining engineer, the company choose one, the two to select a third, for the same purpose; also, that the men appointed by the miners shall not be employes of the Santa Fe company, or in any way connected with it, and they shall make affidavit to give a correct account of the cause of the disaster according to their best judgment.

Resolved, That the men appointed by the miners to investigate shall have power to appoint the mining engineer for the men. The investigating committee appointed by the miners to consist of **Joseph Tubble, of Weir City,** and Wm. Gardner, of Fleming.

Resolved, That we highly censure Gov. J. A. Martin for appointing G. W. Findlay as state mine inspector.

Resolved, That we extend our sincere thanks to the citizens of Pittsburg and vicinity for the noble services rendered in this calamity.

Resolved, That each miner contribute fifty bushels of hands to cont
