

October 1.—Miss Kate A. Hubbell, who resides about a mile west of Centro Bennington, has many old relics in the house that were the property of her grandfather, Aaron Hubbell, who was at 21 years of age a private in the company of Capt. David Robinson, participated in the Bennington battle and was one of the guard that escorted the Hessian prisoners back to the village of Bennington. Among the relics are several old books, including "Meditations on the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper," which was printed in London by the Newcombs for George Thompson at the Rose and Crown in St. Paul's Churchyard in 1658. There is also an English reader on pieces in prose and poetry by Lindley Murray, printed and published by Samuel Mills in Burlington, Vt. in 1815. Near by is the second oldest house in town, having been built in 1760, and being in the possession of the Hubbell family since 1780. In one door is a hole, made by a bullet fired from the gun of a Hessian trooper.
