

50 PRISONERS

Sentenced by Judge Cochran at London Term of Court

The November term of the United States and District Courts which has just closed at London was the largest Court, so far as criminal business is concerned, that has ever been held at London. In all fifty prisoners were sentenced by District Judge A. M. J. Cochran either to the United States Penitentiary at Atlanta, Ga., or the Laurel County Jail for terms ranging from thirty days to three years.

Those sent to the United States Penitentiary were Gig Maggard, John Russ Dixon, Alex McKnabb and Will Gibbs.

Maggard, Dixon, McKnabb and Gibbs were given one year and one day each in the United States Penitentiary at Atlanta for violating the Internal Revenue laws, this being the second offense for each.

John P. Hubble was given the same sentence for embezzling United States mail matter while acting as Assistant Postmaster at Middlesboro. John R. Young was given three years for various violations of the Internal Revenue laws, including carrying on the business of a distillery without having registered and giving bond as required by law, and removing distilled spirits to a place other than a Government warehouse.

All the others were sentenced to the Laurel
