

Stockton News: **J. B. Hubble**, of Farmington township, came to Rooks county in the year 1880. At that time his worldly possessions consisted of a team of mules, a plow, a cultivator, and a few household goods. He now owns 325 acres of improved land, a residence and five lots in Stockton, ten head of horses and five cows. He will soon move to town for the purpose of educating his children. In 1891 he raised 3,754 bushels of wheat and 4,000 bushels of corn, a yield of fifty bushels per acre; 1,200 bushels of oats, a yield of sixty bushels per acre, considerable of the oats being so heavy that they fell in the field. In 1892 he raised 2,370 bushels of wheat, 831 bushels of oats and 3,000 bushels of corn. His only help was a boy now 17 years old.
