

THIRD CONGRESS
OF THE
UNITED STATES:

AT THE FIRST SESSION,

Begun and held at the City of PHILADELPHIA, in the state of Pennsylvania,
on Monday the second of December, one thousand seven
hundred and ninety-three.

RESOLVED by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, That the Secretary for the department of War be, and he is hereby directed to make out an exact list of the names of each person returned to him as invalid pensioners, by the Judges of the Circuit Courts of the United States (signing themselves as Commissioners) under the Act of Congress passed the twenty third of March, one thousand seven hundred and ninety two, intituled "An Act to provide for the settlement of claims of widows and orphans, barred by the limitations heretofore established, and to regulate the claims to invalid pensions;" and return to the Judge of each district, one copy of such list, stating particularly, the district from which each person was returned, and that all are by Congress directed not to be entered on the pension-list. And the said Secretary is further directed to return to each District Judge, a list of the names of all such persons, as have been returned as invalid pensioners by the District Judges under the Act of Congress passed the twenty eighth of February, one thousand seven hundred and ninety three, intituled "An Act to regulate claims to invalid pensions;" distinguishing those who have been placed on the pension-list; and those who have not been placed on the same, by reason of their testimony being incomplete, stating particularly, the legal requisite or requisites wanting in the evidence of each; and naming such of them whose evidence of leaving service is not lodged in his office. And the Judges of the several District Courts, upon receipt of the above described lists and statements from the Secretary for the department of War, are hereby directed forthwith to publish the same in one or more of the newspapers published in their respective districts, adding to such publication, the time when the Act regulating the claims to invalid pensions expires.
