Page 21: First of a number of purchases of lands from the Indians to form Woodbury occurred in 1659

Page 32-33: In Stratford between 1665 and 1669, the first Stratford church split along doctrinal lines (half-way covenant). In 1672 one of the factions was granted town privileges and they moved to Woodbury and continued to purchase lands from the Indians.

Page 44: The new town was given the name Woodbury in 1674. Originally part of the newly formed (1666) Fairfield county. In 1751 it became part of Litchfield county.

In this work' all dates of the month, previous to the 14th of September, 1752, are old style, and all after are new style. The year, between the 1st of January and the 25th of March (before the adoption of the new style), is uniformly treated, where a double date is not given, as new style.

D: Births in Washington:

Washington, composed of Judea Society in Woodbury, and New Preston Society, taken from the towns of Kent, Litchfield, and New Milford, was the first town incorporated in the State after the declaration of independence. It was incorporated at a special session of the General Assembly, January 7, 1779, and called Washington, in honor of the commanden-in-chief of the American armies. Judea Society was incorporated October, 1741.

Q: Births in Stratford:

This old town was settled in 1639, and was first called Stratford in 1645. Its Indian name was "Cupheag," and that of its western part, including a part of Fairfield, "Pughquonnuck." This latter territory now constitutes the town of Bridgeport. The old town also contained the societies of North Stratford, now Trumbull, and Ripton and New Stratford, now the towns of Huntington and Monroe. The Second Church in ancient Stratford in the limits of the present town, was established May 5, 1670. On account of ecclesiastical differences, the General Court of the colony granted to the new church the territory of Pemperaug, in the wilderness, in 1672. Crops were planted that year, and a majority of the church moved thither in 1673. The inhabitants were, however, driven back to Stratford by the troubles and dangers of King Philip's War, which broke out in June, 1675. They did not all go back to Woodbury again till 1678, though the strong men, in armed bands, raised some crops there each year. The business and social relations between the two towns for the first fifty years after the settlement of Woodbury were very intimate, and the intermarriages constant. It has become a necessity, therefore, to give the early births, marriages, and deaths in Stratford to complete the record for Ancient Woodbury.
