Camera In Attack On Chateau-Thierry

Landon, Eng. Oct. 14 -- Apropos the new American official war film which was shown privately here and which is about to be generally circulated-called "America's Answer to the Huns"-a good story is told, says

on Chaten-Thierry. When orders came through for two American divisions to go forward to defend Chateau-Thierry, the news flashed around headquarters. Mr. Hatrick, Mr. Hubble and a staff officer set off post haste in a fast car to the scene of action.

Indeed, they established such a speed record that they reached Chateun-Thierry some hours ahead of the American advance guard, and the most formidable machine facing the Germans in that particular locality while they carried out their preliminary shelling of Chatsau-Thierry was on American cinematograph camers, which if it did not operate towards checking the bochs advance, at least faithfully recorded the full
