HISTORY & BIOGRAPHY

Under this heading we present reports and stories, contemporary and from the past, concerning the lives and activities of Hubbells and Hubbles. Contributions of newspaper clippings, original reports and diaries, etc., from all members and friends of the Society, from the Hubbell family everywhere, will be warmly welcomed!

MURDER MOST FOUL

This account is from an unidentified newspaper dated about 1882. The localities mentioned may lie in several states. Isaac Hubbell was most likely brother of John B. Hubbell who built the first hotel in Mantorville, Minnesota, now Hubbell House. The clipping was furnished by Mrs. Ina Hubbell of Angola, Indiana.

"A Deadwood, Dakota newspaper gives the following details of the killing of Mr. Isaac Hubbell, which occurred February 8th. Mr. Hubbell was a brother of Walter Hubbell of Hudson, this county, was 45 years old and had resided in that county [obliterated]. He [carried] considerable property and money, and the deed was no doubt committed to get possession of the money he had with him.

"From Mr. Mark Oliver, who recently arrived from Rocky Point, we have learned the particulars of one of the most cold-blooded murders that ever took place in this section. Some two or three weeks ago a party of seven from Yellowstone, in the vicinity of Miles City, were hunting buffalo near Rocky Point and camped at Warm Spring creek, about twenty miles from that place. Of the party were the Gimmett brothers and Isaac Hubbell. It seems that some difficulty arose between these parties, based upon a former misunderstanding while ranching together on the Yellowstone. Hubbell went into his cabin, or tent and commenced loading his revolver when the cook went out and informed the Gimmett brothers of the fact. They proceeded at once to the door of the cabin, where Jim Gimmett drew his revolver, and without any warning shot Hubbell in the arm. The wounded man fell to the ground and begged for his life, but in vain. Gimmett continued firing until he had put five balls into his victim, killing him instantly. The party carried the body about ten miles toward the river and then 'cached' it in a coulee. They then proceeded to Rocky Point and disposed of their robes, and returning, carried the body back to the scene of the murder and buried it.

"At Rocky Point they told the story of the killing, but claimed the deed was done in self defense, as Hubbell had threatened to kill the entire party. When leaving the above place they claimed they would give themselves up to the authorities at Big Spring creek, but instead of doing so they 'lit out' for their former haunts on the Yellowstone. It is certainly stretching the theory of self defense to a wonderful degree when six men, well armed, must kill a companion before he has made any overt act toward injuring any of them. Those who are best informed concerning the killing pronounce it a cold-blooded murder. It is a pity Gimmett was not captured and served pretty much the same way his victim was. The murder took place on this side of the river, on the Indian reservation, and, we believe, in Choteau county." [Jp]

MY SURPRISE ARRIVAL INTO THE HUBBELL FAMILY

Jane Blinn

Ms. Blinn is a member of the Society who has furnished new information about her Hubbell antecedents.

Several times while camping in France, the campground owner, seeing my name, would become excited, saying in French that the Blinn name was French. Whenever that happened I laughed, saying it was an Irish name. Well, it does sound so much like Flynn or Quinn, doesn't it? But, in Belfast, an Irishman said he had never heard of such an odd name!

My two Blinn aunts reside in Perrysburg, Ohio where my father was born. I asked them what they knew about the name. Blinns came from Pennsylvania and their grandfather, James, had married Mary Foote. My aunts said their father, also James, had several brothers, and one was Hubble Blinn of Washington. They were told he was named for a friend of the family. But, they didn't know the origin of the name either!

With that meager information I spent days in the Perrysburg Library thumbing through old newspapers dating back to 1820. But it took almost four months for me to construct the family of one Richard H. Blinn of Perrysburg. My aunts were astonished to see the results of my research. They could now recall names of forgotten relatives—the children of Richard H. Blinn!

I acquired a little German trailer and thought this would be a good time to spend in the Salt Lake Mormon Library, where I could relax and seek clues on my Blinn problem. One night while working at the library on the Hale microfilm collection, I turned the handle on the machine too far and the film rolled from Blinn to Blynn! On the screen was a notice of the death of Richard H. Blynn, formerly of Litchfield, Connecticut. The 1790 census showed Hosea Blinn; he was there in 1800 and 1820 too, so I tentatively concluded that he was the father of Richard H. Blinn. In Litchfield land records I found Hosea had belonged to the Northbury Society. It was obvious I must go to Connecticut.

I made a trip there to examine the Waterbury and Litchfield land records. I found that I had to push on to Watertown, however, where the town clerk wasn't very helpful when I requested land records rather than vital records. She insisted she did not have any Blinn references in her books, but I asked if I might just see the old books around 1775 to 1800. In the index, staring me in the face was Hosea and Patience Blinn! I was so nervous I could barely turn the pages as I now knew Hosea's wife's name.

The land records revealed a reference to the estate of a Richard Hubbell (94). He had a grist mill on the West Branch in the township of Watertown, and named his daughters and sons-in-law in the deed. They were: Jeremiah and Jedidah Renney, Hosea and Patience Blinn, Friend and Mary Clark of Woodbury, Hezekiah and Eunice Hopkins of Harwinton. I knew now that Richard H. Blinn had received his name from his grandfather, Richard Hubbell.

Richard Hubbell died April 16, 1777 of small pox, in Plymouth, Connecticut, and his property was distributed to his wife Jedidah and to each of his daughters.

Still seeking the origin of Blinn, I thought now to search another line. I picked Polly Blinn, sister of Richard, who married Abijah Peck. They moved from Litchfield to Canfield, Ohio where one of their daughters married a Bostwick. I made enquiries about Bostwicks, and to my surprise received a response from a woman who had a Bostwick Bible showing Hosea Blinn! The Bible revealed that Hosea had served with the British during the Revolutionary War, and had come to Litchfield via Montreal and Vermont.

Well, I am still on the trail of the origin of the Blinns in America, but I thought members of the Society would like to know of my success turning up Hubbell relatives along the way. I have been fortunate in my searches in many ways, and I expect to continue to be lucky. Does anyone know anything about Blinns? I would be pleased to share my data with any interested party.

DEVILS IN THE FOREST?

Robert D. Thompson, of Rock, Worcestershire, England

Whether you believe in spirits or not, does not matter; the point is, your ancestors did! If you will bear with me, I will produce evidence of this belief and of the part played by devils in the life of Wyre Forest.

Not far from my home is the pub where I partake of my weekly pint. It lies in a quiet nook where the Porch Brook comes down from Clows Top before it winds its way past Worsley down to the Severn. Today it is called the Porch Brook, but in 1831 it was Poach Brook.

Does that name suggest anything to you? No, not eggs. If you are Welsh, you will recognize the "pwca" means a goblin or a fiend, so Porch Brook means the Brook of the Goblins. Here we have an example of the survival of the Celtic awareness of the spirit world. It used to be thought that the Anglo-Saxons obliterated Welsh culture, but in the border region, Welsh was spoken as much as English right up to the end of the 16th century. Welsh surnames appear on the first pages of the Rock parish register, which begins in 1574. Welsh place names abound, and an interesting point is that river names are all Welsh—interesting because it suggests that there was considerable intermarriage between the English men and Welsh women—the women taught their children their native names for the commodity they used most.

Goblins and spirits played a large part in the twilight world of Celtic imagination. There can be little doubt that Shakespeare heard about them at school, for his schoolmaster was Thomas Jenkins, a Welshman. The average Englishman of Shakespeare's day was well aware that Owen Glendower had led his Welshmen to the walls of Worcester and had encamped on the hills near Abberley. The accession of the Welsh Tudor monarchs had brought a horde of their countrymen seeking advancement, among them the ancestors of Oliver Cromwell.

I have been concerned to show that our ancestors readily accepted belief in the occult, and that the belief was particularly strong in the Welsh border country. We are now in a position to consider the import of the will of John Hubbole of Pensax who died in 1607. He describes himself as a "suger," and for a long time this word puzzled me. I was not sure that I had read it correctly, but eventually I found it in another document dated 1595 relating to the customs of the manor of Abberley. There John Suger was a copyholder, so obviously the name belonged to an occupation which could also be a surname, like Thatcher, Smith or Baker—but what was a "suger"?

In his "History of Far Forest" Rev. William Elliott says a "shugar" was a large building stone from the quarry in the lane called Sugars Lane, where it is said that the stone for Far Forest Church was obtained. Dr. Reaney associates Sugarswell Barn in Warwickshire with robbers, and this is a possibility, for the forest was noted for its lawlessness, but on the other hand, our John of Pensax, about to meet his Maker when he made his will, would scarcely describe himself as an evil-doer.

When I was inquiring about Sugars Lane in Far Forest, it occurred to me that the name could relate to Shuckburg, also in Warwickshire. Dr. Reaney and Dr. Gelling ("Signposts to the Past") say that the name derives from Old English "scucca" meaning a demon. This explanation fits neatly into my scenario of a countryside inhabited by devils, but would John Hubbole, good Puritan, be likely to describe himself as a devil?

The surname Suger appears in an agreement dated 1595 concerning Bayton, which was part of the manor which remained attached to Abberley when Rock and most of the forest was given to the monks of St. Evroul after the Norman Conquest. Suger does not appear in our telephone directory, though the name Shuker appears 14 times. Shuck seems related to it and is entered 38 times! Study of surnames in telephone directories is useful. Families listed there are likely to be rooted and established in a given area.

According to the Oxford English Dictionary, the word "shuck" is derived from "scucca." But, it has another meaning—husk, pod, shell, something valueless that could be thrown away. I was interested that in American slang it could be applied to a blueback currency note issued by the Confederacy during the American Civil War and valueless thereafter. Oh, shucks!

If "shuck" could mean husk, etc., then it could be applied to the bark of a tree, so a Suger or a Shuker must be the same as a Peeler or a Barker—one who removes the bark of oak trees to make liquid used for tanning leather. In itself, the bark is of little value. But for tanning leather, it could be very valuable. Untanned leather cracks and is useless. It is not easy for us to realize the esteem our forefathers had for leather because it has been largely replaced by plastics. Our ancestors used it for footwear, boats, tents, bottles, sails, books, clothing, etc. St. Cuthbert valued his boots so much that he would take them off only once a year on Maundy Thursday to wash his feet!

John Hubbole the suger had a son-in-law named Leonard Monnox who was a tanner living at the top of Wyre Hill in Bewdley. He was not the only practitioner of the art in the town, for the parish register mentions other tanners: Thomas Boylson/Boyleston, Francis Wakeman, John Wakeman and others. The memory of their activities is preserved in local place names such as Tanners Hill and Tanners Brook. This was a well-established community linked together by intermarriage, and this was clearly shown in the social tensions of the seventeenth century. When the Stuart government and the local landlords sought to restrict squatting in the forest and to reimpose the ancient forest laws, the tanners felt insecure and so we find them on the Puritan side in the Civil War. Some members of the Hubbell [Hubbole] and Wakeman families migrated to America where they helped to found the colony of New Haven in Connecticut. Thomas Boyleson became a captain in the New Model Army—money for the support of Oliver Cromwell's campaign in Ireland was collected in Bewdley by a tanner from Kings Norton. Thomas was the father of Sares Boyleston, rector of Rock. . . .

Bob Thompson has written a series of scholarly evaluations of the earlier life and times in Rock and vicinity, all of which contain observations and references to the history of the Hubbell family in that part of Worcestershire. We are grateful to Bob for supplying these valuable insights. This study has been edited from a longer paper, examining interesting aspects of 17th century life in Rock and surrounding communities where our antecedents likely lived for centuries.
