

Annual Recognizes Contributions of Robert L. Hubbell

On behalf of the Society, the editor would like to take this opportunity to recognize and commend the efforts of Robert Lamson Hubbell, former Society President, for his tenure as editor of both the *Annual* and *Family Notes*. Robert had passed along his editorship of *Family Notes*, intending to remain as editor of the *Annual*. Unfortunately, Robert suffered a stroke last March, rendering him unable to continue in this capacity. What follows is an excerpt from his annual holiday letter, dictated to his daughter Marcia Bachman:

"Two years ago I reported the sad news of Betty's [his wife] untimely death, September 30, 1996. Then in the fall of 1997, Elsie Guilford, who had come to this retirement community [Westminster-Canterbury Retirement Community, Westminster, Virginia] in April of that year, asked for a ride to church. That happened to be the weekend of the annual church picnic, for which I had made a piccalilli casserole the day before. We began seeing each other, and spent every evening in January and early February enjoying the Winter Olympics together. In mid-February, we became engaged. To my great joy, my three daughters enthusiastically approved.

In mid-March, I had a stroke which paralyzed my left arm and leg. Recovery has been slow. I have regained some use of the leg, but not the arm, so I need considerable care... [from] Elsie, who is an RN (retired nurse) ...We went ahead with the wedding in June. Since then, I have been a resident in the Health Care section of the retirement community.

Elsie is a widow who has lost two husbands. So I acquired a new family of three daughters, a step-daughter, six grandchildren, four step-grandchildren, four great-grandchildren, and four step-great-grandchildren, at the moment. Elsie awaits the arrival of two more great-grandchildren!

The Episcopal Church requires its clergy to give premarital counseling. Elsie and I were curious about the advice we, who had 97 years of marital experience between us, would receive from a 48-year-old bachelor. He stated he would not emphasize family planning. Doug (the minister) was very helpful in planning the details of an open church wedding. Elsie's granddaughter, Debbie Kane, was Matron of Honor and Bob's grandson, John Insley, was Best Man. Two of Bob's sons-in-law, one other grandson, and a cousin were ushers.

We celebrated Bob's 80th birthday at the beginning of August with a family dinner. The birthday cake was made by one of Elsie's granddaughters-in-law, decorated with a map to symbolize Bob's travels and the shaking hands symbol of USAID. The dinner was served in a private room at the retirement community and was attended by four generations."

The editor wishes to acknowledge the leadership and service that Robert has provided the Society's periodical publications during his editorship. He will continue to be recognized, with the title of *Editor Emeritus*, in both the *Annual* and *Family Notes*. Our continued best wishes to Bob and his family.

HUBBELL CENTER

Members should know that Library holdings at Hubbell Center have been catalogued by Librarian Patricia Dawson.

Pat has divided the various books, papers, folders, maps, and other collections into thirteen categories-- enabling the researcher to readily determine whether the item sought is held by the Center.

The thirteen categories named below give the number of "titles", principally books and pamphlets (but not runs of periodicals) in each category, with notes on some of the holdings:

Edwin Powell Hubble, Astronomer

(Editor's Note: The 1999 Biennial Reunion in Springfield, MO will honor this pioneer of modern astronomy, for whom the Hubble Space Telescope is named.)

Hubble, Edwin Powell - (b. Nov. 20, 1889, Marshfield, Mo., U.S.—d. Sept. 28, 1953, San Marino, Calif.), American astronomer who is considered the founder of extragalactic astronomy and who provided the first evidence of the expansion of the universe.

Hubble's interest in astronomy flowered at the University of Chicago, where he was inspired by the astronomer George E. Hale. At Chicago, Hubble earned both an undergraduate degree in mathematics and astronomy (1910) and a reputation as a fine boxer. Upon graduation, however, Hubble turned away from both astronomy and athletics, preferring to study law as a Rhodes Scholar at the University of Oxford (B.A., 1912). He joined the Kentucky bar in 1913 but dissolved his practice soon after, finding himself bored with law. A man of many talents, he finally chose to focus them on astronomy, returning to the University of Chicago and its Yerkes Observatory in Wisconsin. After earning a Ph.D. in astronomy (1917) and serving in World War I, Hubble settled down to work at the Mount Wilson Observatory near Pasadena, Calif., and began to make discoveries concerning extragalactic phenomena.

While at Mount Wilson, Hubble discovered (1922-24) that not all nebulae in the sky are part of the Milky Way Galaxy, the vast star system to which the Sun belongs. He found that certain nebulae contain stars called Cepheid variables, for which a correlation was already known to exist between periodicity and absolute magnitude. Using the further relationship among distance, apparent magnitude, and absolute magnitude, Hubble determined that these Cepheids are several hundred thousand light-years away and thus outside the Milky Way system and that the nebulae in which they are located are actually galaxies distinct from the Milky Way. This discovery, announced in 1924, forced astronomers to revise their ideas about the cosmos.

Soon after discovering the existence of these external galaxies, Hubble undertook

the task of classifying them according to their shapes (1926) and exploring their stellar contents and brightness patterns. In studying the galaxies, Hubble made his second remarkable discovery—namely, that these galaxies are apparently receding from the Milky Way and that the further away they are, the faster they are receding (1927). The implications of this discovery were immense. The universe, long considered static, was expanding; and, even more remarkably, as Hubble discovered in 1929, the universe was expanding in such a way that the ratio of the speed of the galaxies to their distance is a constant now called Hubble's constant.

Although Hubble was correct that the universe was expanding, his calculation of the value of the constant was incorrect, implying that the Milky Way system was larger than all other galaxies and that the entire universe was younger than the surmised age of the Earth. Subsequent astronomers, however, revised Hubble's result and rescued his theory, creating a picture of a cosmos that has been expanding at a constant rate for 10 billion to 20 billion years.

For his achievements in astronomy, Hubble received many honours and awards. Among his publications were *Red Shifts in the Spectra of Nebulae* (1934) and *The Hubble Atlas of Galaxies* (published posthumously, 1961, and edited by Allan Sandage). Hubble remained an active observer of galaxies until his death.

JOHN B. HUBBELL and the HUBBELL HOUSE

(Remarks by Alfred B. Bunnett for the Plaque Dedication at the Hubbell House, Mantorville, MN - August 22, 1998.)

John B. Hubbell came north to Mantorville in the Fall of 1854, after the Mantors had established the town the previous Spring. His Canadian-born wife, Catherine, stayed behind in Indiana, where the couple's 5th child was born in 1854 (Mary Hubbell). He built a log house inn that had a second floor sleeping room often packed with lodgers.

1855 was a good year for John B. That Fall, he was elected to the Territorial Legislature. The Governor of Minnesota appointed him sheriff of Dodge County-- in the belief that Hubbell was a solid Democrat-- although contemporary commentators later admitted that many of these appointees were closet Republicans. In July, he led a posse several miles north in pursuit of two Indians believed to have stolen a wallet and \$65 from E. A. Bunker's cabin while he was in the fields. Hubbell was a natural leader-- or, at least he had the only horse in town.

1856 saw the construction of a fine stone hotel building, with John B. serving as developer, evidently. In the July 30, 1857 edition of the *Mantorville Express*, a story notes that Hubbell took over management of the Hotel from a Mr. Stringham. The building is a "three-story edifice built of stone and is one of the finest buildings of Southern Minnesota".

1857 began with great optimism for the Hubbells of Mantorville. John B. was one of the village trustees. He founded with others including the Mantors, the Postmaster Shober, and one of the local attorneys, Mr. LeDuc, the Free Mason Lodge #1, AF&AM.

He built a 33 by 66 foot stone barn addition to the original hotel (two of his neighbors in the October, 1857 census were stone masons). The *Express* teased that this was a fort to be used in case of Indian hostilities, or as a State Prison built on Speculation (August 20, 1857).

The Hubbell House served as the social and meeting center of the community. The founding meeting of the Dodge County Agricultural Society took place in its rooms in August, 1857. Hubbell was asked to judge and award the \$4.00 prize for the best mare and colt at the County Fair (Minnesota's first) later that Fall. Mrs. G. W. Shultes advertised that her "Fashionable Milliner and Dressmaker was the first door south of Hubbell's Hotel... with Bonnets and Bonnet trimmings."

The Hotel was also the scene of discussions on the citizens need to tax themselves to provide schools, a jail, and a Courthouse. And, no doubt endless discussions about bringing a railroad to Mantorville... which did not happen until 1896.

1858 brought financial trouble to John B., much of the rest of Mantorville, and the rest of the nation. The failure of an insurance company in Cincinnati, OH triggered a financial panic in late 1857. Land prices in government land office sales in Minnesota from over \$1.00 per acre in 1855 to a nickel an acre in 1858. The nation underwent deflation at the same time Hubbell had mortgage loans at 40% interest secured in boom times at "wild

cat bank rates". (Rates in Minnesota on loans ranged from 15% to 72%. Deposits paid 12% to 18% during the period before 1860.)

Still, the Hubbell House continued as the premier business address in Mantorville. S. W. Dorsey advertised that his Dageurreotype and Ambrotype business would be open in the "apartment over the School Room in J. B. Hubbell's new Store building". The organizing meeting for a Farmer's Association was held in April, 1858 in the Hotel. The *Express* ran the Hubbell House ad side-by-side with Mortgage sale notices for various John B. Hubbell lots and buildings, and a Sheriff sale of property (for the Lodge?) jointly owned by Hubbell and several other prominent citizens.

The Hotel was sold in August, 1858, but the hotel business continued under the name "Hubbell House" while under lease to Cheney and Beecher (1859), the second in a line of entrepreneurs-- the most important and enduring of which was and is the Pappas family, our hosts today.

In the Census of **1860**, John B. Hubbell is no longer in Mantorville, but his older brother Walter, the farmer, is.

As a real estate developer, some might say that John B. Hubbell was the Donald Trump of Mantorville in 1856-57. I should be surprised if Trump's name remains on any of his marquee properties 140 years hence.

Wanda Hubble Puckett 1919 - 1998

HFHS member 11408. Mrs. Wanda Hubble Puckett, a retired Fairfield, Illinois school teacher passed away on June 8, 1998 of a heart attack. She had been successfully recovering from brain surgery only a month prior to the sudden heart attack. Services for Mrs. Puckett were held at Fairfield First Christian Church on June 10th, with burial at Maple Hill Cemetery.

Born in Enterprise, Illinois on May 2, 1919, she was the daughter of 8847. Ora Johnston and Grace Galbreath Hubble. Her father had been mayor of Fairfield, as had her husband of 56 years, Samuel J. Puckett.



Mrs. Puckett, holding both a BA and MA in education, taught elementary education in the Fairfield school system for 20 years. She was also very active as a member of First Christian Church and also had servered on the board of the Fairfield Public Library.

HFHS members will recall that Wanda was an active member of the Society, carrying on a tradition of maintaining family heritage instilled by her father. She provided valuable comment and insight on her family for the *Additions & Revisions to the History & Genealogy of the Hubbell Family*, and attended local and HFHS reunions.

Surviving are her husband, Sam; two sons, James Puckett of Indianapolis, IN and Michael Puckett of Linton, IN; two daughters, Jane Miller and Judith Puckett, both of Fairfield; five grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and brother, 11409. Gene Hubble of Phoenix, AZ.

FOUND:

The Identity of Katherine Hubbell, Sculptor

The 1997 Annual featured a query regarding "Katherine Hubbell, Sculptor" originating from (non-Hubbell descendant) John Strawbridge, III of Washington, CT, seeking to identify the creator of an attractive bronze sculpture he owns. A photograph of this piece shows an 8" high figure of a seated nude female, eyes downcast. weighs 4 pounds, 12 ounces.

The bronze was only inscribed "K. Hubbell", with a foundry mark. Strawbridge had bought it years earlier at a flea market from a dealer who had himself purchased it at an estate sale in upper New York State. John was able to identify a bronze foundry whose records contained the name of a Katherine Hubbell, revealing that a sculpture fitting these dimensions was cast, in duplicate, in July 1917 at a cost of \$262 (which was promptly paid!). The same year, Katherine Hubbell became a life member of the Art Students League of New York City.

Surprisingly, placement of this Katherine Hubbell on the family tree was only "just around the corner", coming from my Rowayton neighbor and HFHS member, William Hubbell Axness, descendant of 4442. Albert Cicero Hubbell of Michigan. Interestingly, 9653. Albert C. Hubbell, well-known artist for *The New Yorker Magazine*, also descends from 4442. Albert. In early 1998, after seeing the query, William informed me that he owned the duplicate of John Strawbridge's bronze, and was able to place the sculptor as 6985. Katherine Hubbell, William's great aunt, from whom he obtained his copy. A daughter of 4442. Albert, Katherine was an active woman, despite having lost a leg in an automobile accident. Notwithstanding, she travelled abroad, studied in Austria, and led a busy life in New York City. William recalls her as a "spry old lady" who took her very young relative to New York concerts and exhibits, hobbling about skillfully with her canes. She died in 1976, in her nineties!

Early in 1997, Jack J. Hubbell of Springfield, MO discovered the interesting business sign (pictured here) in an antiques store in Taos, New Mexico, fixed to the wall of the store. Jack says that it took some time and persuasion to remove and sell it to him.



It's a 36" x 23" framed board, painted red, on which appear, in different colors, the very neatly and attractively painted words. The several decorative devices have been equally skillfully and colorfully done. As is shown, the sign announces a "Hubble Trading Post" and dates it at 1887. The business being conducted is characterized as an Indian agency and the agent has trading privileges. Treaties between the U. S. government and various Indian tribes sometimes might place a shield between commercial ventures of white men and the Indians, likely quite unfamiliar with routine commercial practices, by setting controls on selected activities. Trading concessions might be granted to designated individuals officially appointed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs. Such activities could become very profitable and, sad to say, sometimes not to the advantage of the intended customers—the Indian tribes.

This sign is unusual because if its spelling: *HUBBLE*. We have not placed a member of the family using that spelling (residing presumably in the Southwest) who was trading with Indians in one of the states with a sufficiently large Indian population to justify its official Indian agency status. The best known branch of the family in this field was, of course, that of John Lorenzo Hubbell, who established a large commercial venture with the Navajo in Ganado, New Mexico. There is no indication that Lorenzo or any member of that branch, some of whom also were Indian traders (usually in cooperation with Lorenzo), used the *HUBBLE* spelling.

Harold B. Hubbell of Rowayton, CT enjoys a "half-share" of the sign with Jack. At present, it reposes on a wall in Harold's house, where the photo was taken. Jack and Harold plan to exchange it between each other from time to time. In due course, when active interest in Hubbell Center's mission by HFHS membership has advanced further, they plan to place it at Hubbell Center on extended loan.
