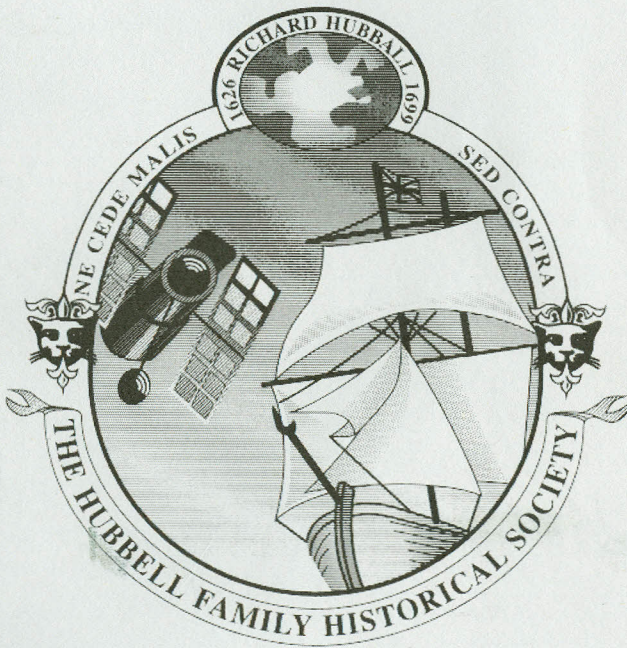

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

This past year we celebrated our 10th biennial meeting in Kenai, Alaska. Dr. Peter (Pete) Hansen and his beautiful wife, Karolee, provided all who were able to attend a glimpse of what life is like in what was once considered "Seward's Folly." Trips to Seward and Homer Spit were highlights of the week. One of my fondest memories is photographing a moose standing next to a corner lot "For Sale" sign within the city limits. Due to the Alaskan meeting location, the Society attracted many members that had never been at previous meetings, and we received two new memberships. At this meeting, Robert (Camino Bob) Hubbell accepted the Nominating Committee Chair, along with seven new Directors that were elected to replace retiring members. At the Saturday night banquet, Ernest Hubbell was inducted into the Hubbell Hall of Fame. Along with Ernest, four additional members that contributed much of their time to the growth of the Society during its early years were also recognized.

This past summer, Madalene and I attended the Nehemiah Hubble Family Heritage Association Annual Picnic in Campbellford, Ontario. There were many requests by our Canadian cousins to have The Hubbell Family Historical Society to hold a biennial reunion meeting in Canada in 2005. Their request will be placed on the agenda at the Executive Committee meeting in April. All Society members that wish to have a reunion meeting held in their area are invited to submit their request to a member of the Board of Directors.

The Historical Society of Easton requested a contribution to assist them in obtaining a grant from the State of Connecticut Historic Commission to complete Phase I of the Bradley-Hubbell House Restoration Plan. The Board of Directors approved a contribution of \$500.00.

The Society purchased 100 *Rock 2000* books from the Rock Parish Council for sale to our members. The book is a portrait of the current life in the Rock Parish, containing a chapter on the Hubbell family connection and describing visits to the area in 1988 and 1994.

Genealogy Committee Chair and THFHS Vice-President Hilbert R. Hubble has completed *A Military History of the Hubbell Family in North America*. Pre-publication order forms were recently mailed along with the annual dues forms to all Society members. More information regarding the book's contents is included in this *Annual*.

The *Hubbell by Choice* book is currently under development by Membership Chair Carol Hubbell Boggs of Chapel Hill, NC; Marjorie Hubbell Gibson of Cotuit, MA; Mary Ann (Mrs. James) Hubbell of Logan, UT; Barbara (Mrs. Charles) Kruse, of East Northport, NY; and Elberta Herman of Bridge City, TX. While all act as researchers they have specialized roles within the team-- Barbara acquires permissions, Marge and Mary Ann conduct the nitty-gritty genealogical work, Bertie and Carol edit and proofread, and Carol also works with the digitizing, data entry, coordination, and overview of the project. Hilbert Hubble also provides genealogical consultation and advice.

New Director (8677) Marjorie Hubbell Kimmel Hlava and 9310 Robert H. Hubbell have been helpful in following up with an organization to preserve the Hubbell House in Albuquerque, New Mexico. The Hubbell House Alliance was formed to preserve the property and house. Through efforts of the Alliance, the Bernalillo Parks and Recreation Department purchased the property. The Hubbell family originally operated it as a sheep ranch. Marjorie is preparing a report for the April meeting of the Executive Committee in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. More detail information regarding the Albuquerque Hubbell House will appear in the spring *Family Notes*.

Finally, it is my sad duty to report the passing of (1078) Maureen McClintock Rischard. As the Chair for Hubbell Hall of Fame Committee, she was the driving force to formalize the process and procedure for evaluating and selecting Hall of Fame honorees. Much of the work produced by the Committee was a result of her prior experience in her volunteer work with local organizations. Last September, Madalene and I visited with her and Ted at their farm in Santa Ana, California, where we discussed the future for the Hall of Fame. Many of her suggestions and ideas to promote not only the Hall of Fame, but also the Society, will remain with us for many years to come. Her passing is a personal loss to both Madalene and me, and a significant loss to the Society.

THFHS Publishes Military History

The Hubbell Family Historical Society announces the publication of *A Military History of the Hubbell Family in North America*. The book was written by Commander Hilbert R. Hubble USN (Ret) and documents the service of all Hubbell/Hubble/Hubel/Hubbels in the United States and Canada for which records can be found. The book starts with the colonial militia and continues until the recent activities in Kosovo. Contributions by family members include letters, diaries, photographs, and memoirs. Each chapter sets the stage by a description of the conditions facing the Hubbell service men and women including what they wore, what they ate, recruiting, pensions, etc. Specific actions in which Hubbells are known to participate are described next followed by a short biography for each service member.

The book is one of a series of Hubbell Family Historical Society Publications including the 1980 *History and Genealogy of the Hubbell Family*, the 1989 *Hubbell Pioneers*, the 1995 *Additions and Revisions to the History and Genealogy of the Hubbell Family* and the soon to be published *Hubbell By Choice*.

THFHS General Meeting - June 20, 2001 - Kenai, Alaska

Introductions of all present included first time attendees Nelson and Sandra Hubbell from San Diego; Gordon Hubbell from Logan, Utah; Dorothy Madden of Oregon; Roger and Sally Hubbell from Ohio; Nancy, Tom and Caitlyn Hubbell (who explained they were "double" Hubbells); Sue and Bob Lewis of California; Lydia Wirkus and sons Faustin and Russell (helping with registration) from Alaska; John Crowder and wife Mildred of Big Lake, Alaska; Sue Devermann; Carol Joyner and husband from Mississippi; Mary Ann Haslip and 2 sons from Florida; Heather Hlava and Paul Kotula; Marjorie and Paul Hlava from Albuquerque; Kitty VerKuilen from Wisconsin. Greetings were sent from the Nehemiah Hubble Family Heritage Association of Canada via William Hubel with an invitation to participate in the Canadian Society meeting in July 2001.

Treasurer's Report. Since Treasurer Claire Pierce was unable to attend, a written report was given by President Donald C. Hubbell showing an opening balance for 2000 of \$20,735.18, income of \$18,802.49, and a balance in the Canadian account of \$4091.12, for a total of \$43,628.79. Donations to Hubbell Center and Hubbell Scholarship Fund totaled \$12,608.99. Expenses were \$6047.81, leaving a balance of \$24,971.99 through December 31, 2000. For the first five months of 2001, income reported as \$15,249.98, donations to Hubbell Center and Scholarship Fund \$8,219.75, expenses of \$6117.44, leaving a balance on June 1, 2001, of \$26,884.78.

One expense this year was obtaining 100 copies of the *Rock 2000* book from the British community of Rock, Worchestershire. Copies are for sale to members with profits benefiting the Rock Church restoration project. Donald read a letter from Claire expressing her regret at missing the meeting and sending her greetings along with her report.

Donald also presented the Scholarship Fund Treasurer's Report beginning with a balance on December 31, 1999 of \$9,418.49. After expenses and scholarship distributions, the balance on December 31, 2000 was \$3,969.41. As of June 16, 2001, the balance was \$3645.43 plus a \$5,000 CD maturing August 13, 2001, and a \$8,000 CD maturing January 16, 2002.

Committee Reports. Written reports from Membership (Carol Boggs), Genealogy (Hilbert Hubble), and Publications (John A. Hubble) were distributed to those present since the committee chairmen were not able to attend. Jean N. Hubbell added the "Caring Society" report as an extension of the Membership Committee report. In addition to cards mailed following the Springfield meeting, numerous get well and sympathy cards were sent to members whose names and situations were sent to her during the two-year period. For this meeting twenty-three cards were prepared for signing. These included many regular attendees unable to attend and greatly missed. Other names were submitted by members present.

Hall of Fame Committee. Maureen Rischard, Chairman, recounted the Committee's actions since last reunion and outlined the Committee's procedures for electing this year's Hall of Fame nominees. For the future, she said consideration must be given to how to honor recipients, and what will be placed in Hubbell Center.

Hubbell Center. James Windsor Hubbell, Jr., President of Hubbell Center, reported receipts of \$6,000 in contributions, a balance at the end of the year of \$6700 and a CD of \$8,000. He said Harold B. Hubbell had retired as President, he became the new President and Harvey Hubbell IV is Vice-President. The Board of Directors met in Des Moines in August 2000 and asked Doug Poulter for ideas on what Hubbell Center should be and do. Need for more recognition was one response, through exposure of Hubbell Center as part of our THFHS website. A committee is planned for updating the website for topics in addition to Hubbell Center. A new brochure was developed for distribution to the membership to increase visitation. Currently, only about six to seven people visit the Center in a year's time.

Harvey Hubbell IV gave some historical commentary starting with Walter Hubbell in 1880 and the first Hubbell genealogy book. One hundred years later Harold B. Hubbell and Donald Sidney Hubbell updated the research began with that book. The Hubbell Center is a pioneer effort-- it can be

a collection point for memorabilia. It is planned to be technologically connected, providing information via computer.

A portrait by Bradford Hubbell thought to have been painted in 1936 was donated to Hubbell Center by Jean and Frank McNamara who inherited the portrait from their aunt and uncle. There is a need for further documentation, but the belief is that the portrait was originally purchased at a sale. James Windsor and Harvey IV accepted the portrait on behalf of Hubbell Center. A thank-you letter was sent to the McNamaras.

James Windsor presented the names of Officers and Directors to be elected for Hubbell Center: Pres. James Windsor Hubbell, Jr., V.P. Harvey Hubbell, IV, Treas. James W. Hubbell, III; Directors: David Bridgewater, Luther Hill, William B. Friedrich, Doug Poulter, Carol Boggs, Robert Dexter Hubbell, and Ex Officio, Donald Clayton Hubbell. **MOTION** by Jean Peterson (seconded, Margie Hlava) to elect as presented. The motion was **PASSED**.

Scholarship Fund. On behalf of Fund President Harold G. Hubbell who was unable to attend, Director Clifton Hubbell used his time of reporting to constitute the meeting of the Scholarship Fund which is a separate entity from THFHS for tax purposes, but all members of THFHS are also members of the Scholarship Fund. All Fund directors agreed to continue to serve. **MOTION** by Maureen Rischard to accept the list was amended to include Kitty VerKuilen (volunteer) to the others. The motion was **PASSED**.

Eligibility requirements for recipients of scholarships were enumerated-- first year of college successfully completed, descendant of Richard Hubball, membership in THFHS (or parent or grandparent), undergraduates only. The question of what is a descendant was raised and opinions expressed. Adopted children would be considered same as birth children. The issue of step-children brought the most discussion. Opinions varied from excluding no one to bloodline or legal adoption only. The Fund Board of Directors was asked to clarify this for future scholarships..

Special Projects. Hubbell by Choice - Mary Ann Hubbell reported on this initiative begun by Carol Boggs with help from Mary Ann and Marjorie Gibson Hubbell. The project begins with the genealogy of Sarah Wakeman, mother of Richard Hubball the immigrant, and includes three generations forward and back for each wife of the first generation. Mary Ann said they hoped the project would be finished this year, but proving the genealogical information takes a great deal of time.

The finished book will be the first of its kind. Mary Ann gave several illustrations of how the information in the book will affect what we know of Hubbells and what influences shaped their lives. This first book begins with Sarah Wakeman, and includes Richard and his wives, his sons' wives and his grandsons' wives. There are many women involved in those generations; Carol is making intricate charts. The team hopes to continue the work on Hubbell wives with future books.

Mayor's Welcome. Dr. Pete Hansen introduced John Williams, Mayor of Kenai for the last fifteen years. Mayor Williams stated he and Dr. Pete go back a long time, but that 1,000 years ago, Kenai was inhabited by the original people of the area. Written history goes back to 1791 and Russian-American Trading Co. Furs, then fishing, were the main industries. Alaska was sold to America in 1867 for \$7,200,000. Shortly thereafter gold was discovered. Over \$35 million in gold came from Alaska, and now three times that in oil each day, in 800,000 barrels of oil. Commercial fishing has grown enormously in last 10-15 years. Kenai also has one of just 43 Challenger Space Learning Centers in the world and the only one in Alaska. Just then Kenai was undergoing the longest run of sunny weather ever, with lots of moose around. Mayor Williams concluded with a hearty welcome to Kenai and to Alaska.

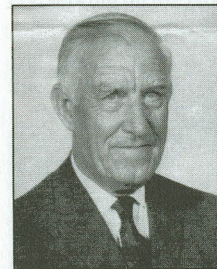
Addition to HUBBELL CENTER Collection

The Center has received a videotape of the Bradley-Hubbell House in Easton, Connecticut. This videotape will interest the many members of the Hubbell family whose antecedents lived in the Easton/Weston area of Connecticut in the 1700s and 1800s. Filmed in 2000 in connection with important restoration work of this old home, the videotape offers a tour of the house. The dwelling is of the style our antecedents would have known well. Most of them would have lived in a very similar structure-- and many would likely have seen this very house! Work is being conducted under careful supervision of The Historical Society of Easton, owner of the house. THFHS has joined various Connecticut organizations making generous contributions to the restoration work, donating \$1000.00 in 1999 during the exterior phase of the project and an additional \$500.00 in 2002 for the current campaign to raise money for the interior restoration.

The Bradley-Hubbell House house was built in 1816 by Abijah Bradley to replace an older homestead on the same site to which he had moved in 1812. Aside from The Hubbell Trading Post in Ganado, this is one of the only publicly-owned structures we know of with verifiable Hubbell connections.

Franklin Hubbell (A&R 10135) moved into the old Bradley house in 1917, and he and wife Helen (Osborne) raised their family there. The film features an interview with 12565 Patricia Hubbell, daughter of Franklin and Helen. As manager of land resources for the Bridgeport Hydraulic Company, Franklin Hubbell planted the fruit trees for the Aspetuck Orchards. One of the first in the state to sell apples from a roadside stand, his first fruit stand for the company became the Aspetuck Orchards, or "the Apple Barn," known today. He served as First Selectman in Easton from 1960 to 1965, and he was widely known and highly respected in town as well as in the company he worked for. He died in 1996, just four months short of his 100th birthday.



Franklin Hubbell

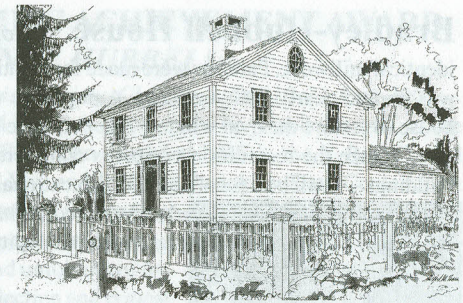
The videotape was filmed by Dolly Curtis Interviews; Dolly Curtis is a friend of 23 years to Patricia Hubbell. Readers will want to examine either *History & Genealogy* or *Additions & Revisions* to determine whether they have antecedents who lived in the Easton/Weston area, and to identify Franklin and Patricia. Reference file [Qf] may be consulted at Hubbell Center.

Bradley-Hubbell House Restoration Project Continues

Easton, CT - The crown jewel of the Bradley-Hubbell House, its oval window, was put back in place in the north gable end of the house in April 2001. The window has become the symbol of the Bradley-Hubbell House Restoration Project, representing what is distinctive about the house's character and the town's history. The design of the oval window itself is unusual. The narrow gracefull shape seems to be unique in the Easton area, according to Historical Society President Lois Bloom.

Time and weather had badly damaged the window, which was the only survivor from a one-time pair. After being removed, the window was fully restored using antique glass of the period and

identical millwork. Patterns were made for creating copies of the window by hand, just as the original was crafted nearly 200 years ago. A duplicate window has been installed in the south gable of the house to restore the oval window that had once been there.

Once the restoration project is completed, the property — with the house, barn, and other buildings — will be a focal point for educational programs, activities, and exhibitions that showcase how the original citizens lived and worked. With the placement of the oval window done, the Easton Historical Society is launching its second capital campaign to raise funds for the restoration of the house's interior.

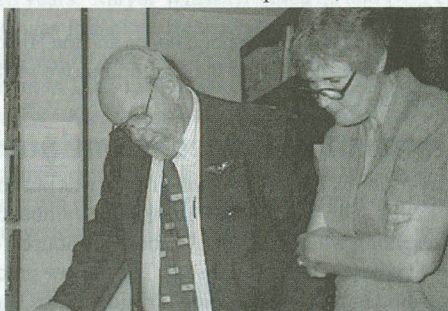
HUBBELL CENTER REVIEW

Hubbell Center conducted a teleconference Board of Directors meeting December 8, 2001, with nine people across the US in virtual attendance. Regularly scheduled meetings in Des Moines are held on the off years between THFHS biennial reunions, during which time the Directors and other family are invited to spend time at the Center, learning more about the family's history, and enjoying the most recent contributions made by the family. Contributions of memoranda and memorabilia continue to be placed in the facility and catalogued by Pat Dawson, our highly regarded Librarian/Archivist who oversees the Center for the family.

There is in particular one Hubbell who keeps an eye open for Hubbell items that come to light in such places as the online auction site, E-bay, and purchases as many of them as possible to preserve them for posterity at Hubbell Center. We have an ongoing drive for funds to match the very generous offer of a member of THFHS to establish a trust for \$100,000 if the family can match it in a given period of time. Hubbell Center occupies an office suite in the historic Hubbell Building for a small yearly rental-- courtesy of Hubbell Realty, the premier real estate company of Des Moines, Iowa.

In upcoming months, the world will be able to preview much of the Center's collection online as a project has begun to expand the Hubbell Center section of the Society's web site located at www.hubbell.org. Photographs of artifacts on display at the Center will be scanned and uploaded to the web site as part of a virtual museum. The "traveling" version of Hubbell Center will also again be on display for a more up-close view at our next Biennial Reunion-- June 2003 in Chapel Hill, North Carolina.

2001 DISTINGUISHED SCIENTIFIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Presented to JOHN H. HUBBELL

At the 46th Annual Meeting of the Health Physics Society, Cleveland, OH 10-14 June 2001

The professional career of John H. Hubbell began in 1950 when he joined the staff of the National Bureau of Standards (now known as NIST). John started at NBS in the X-Ray Crystal Diffraction Group and directed the NBS/NIST X-Ray and Ionizing Radiation Data Center from 1963 to 1981. John worked and published with some of the leading theoretical physicists. His early work dealt with measurements and theoretical analysis of gamma-ray backscattering and unfolding of the energy response of sodium iodide detectors. His collection and critical evaluation of experimental and theoretical photon cross section data resulted in the development of tables of attenuation and energy-absorption coefficients, as well as related quantities such as atomic form factors, incoherent scattering functions, atomic photoeffect, and pair and triplet production cross sections. John's most widely known work is National Standard Reference Data Series Report 29: Photon Cross Sections, Attenuation Coefficients, and Energy Absorption Coefficients from 10 keV to 100 GeV. His database has been used by many scientists, both throughout the U.S. and abroad. One of the pieces of work in which he still takes great pride is the first analytical solution to the Rectangular Source problem, now called the Hubbell Rectangular Source Integral, published in the NBS Journal of Research in 1960.

John has been active in a number of professional societies, and was appointed to serve on several NCRP and ICRU committees. He has been an active member of the American Nuclear Society, serving on the Isotopes and Radiation Division Committee on Radiography and Gauging and as Acting Chair of the Nuclear, Atomic, and Radiation Data Committee. John has been a member of the DOE Cross Section Evaluation Working Group since 1965, and served for six years as the Chair of the General Radiation Protection Section of the HPS Standards Committee.

John's international work has included serving as the NIST principal investigator for the Special Foreign Currency Program India-U.S. Joint X-Ray Data Projects and as Chair of a committee on Food Safety Aspects of Cargo Surveillance Using Megavoltage X-Rays for the World Health Organization and the IAEA. He is a member of the International Higher Education Academy of Sciences in Moscow and is also a Consultant to the LBL/CERN Particle Properties Group. John was a founding member and served as President of the International Radiation Physics Society. He currently serves as a Consultant to the International Commission on Radiation Units and Measurements, as well as the Secretary to the Task Group on X-ray Absorption Coefficients of the International Union of Crystallography.

John has received numerous honors and awards during his career. He is a Fellow of both the Health Physics Society and the American Nuclear Society (ANS). In 1982, he received the Faculty Medal from the Technical University of Prague. In 1985, he received the Paul C. Aebersold Award from the Society of Nuclear Medicine, and in that same year he received the Radiation Industry Award from the ANS. He has also received the Professional Excellence Award from the ANS. In 1995, he received the Outstanding Alumnus Award from the University of Michigan, Department of Nuclear Engineering, and in 1996 he received a Doctor Honoris Causa from the University of Cordoba, Argentina, Faculty of Mathematics, Astronomy and Physics.

John has published extensively during his long and distinguished career, and has published well over 100 papers in the area of radiation physics. So useful and important are these contributions that no less than three of his publications have been named "Citation Classics" by the Institute for

Scientific Information, as evidence for their numerous citations in other papers. At present, he is a consultant to NIST where he continues to play a major role in the X-Ray and Ionizing Radiation Data Center inquiry service to the public and other agencies. He is also Editor-in-Chief of the journal Radiation Physics and Chemistry.

From this impressive list of accomplishments, one might conclude that John would have little time left for pursuits outside of the world of radiation physics. This is far from the case. John was awarded a Bronze Star Medal for his infantry combat service during World War II. He and his wife, Jean, celebrated their 46th wedding anniversary on June 11th, 2001 and have three grown children and eight grandchildren (with another on the way). For a number of years, John was Scoutmaster of a church-sponsored Troop of inner-city boys in Washington, DC. John is also an accomplished harmonica player with a reputation for always having it "at the ready." John has entertained many a colleague, friend, and stranger with his harmonica during his travels. It has been reported that the harmonica has entertained the Boy Scouts, his hosts and visitors on a tour of the Japanese Diet Building, and most recently his colleagues at MC-2000 in Lisbon last October.

John has traveled extensively, both in a professional capacity and to pursue his interest in astronomy. In February of 1979, he departed by automobile for Manitoba, Canada, during the worst winter storm that the region had seen in 50 years in order to view a total solar eclipse. John and Jean followed up that feat with a trip to view a total solar eclipse in Surabaya, Indonesia, on their wedding anniversary in 1983, and another in Baja California Sur, Mexico, in 1991.

Portrait of Catherine Hubbell and Granddaughter Katherine Jane

Editor's Note: This article lists both "Additions & Revisions" and "History & Genealogy" numbers of the persons described. The earlier "H&G" numbers appear second and in parenthesis.

While cleaning out my unclassified Hubbell file, I once again came across this 1908 photograph of an old painting of a mysterious Catherine Hubbell. I now noticed the inscription "For Reginald" on the back of the photo; the book recently donated by 11730 Ron and Karen Hubbell (see related article - ed.) proved to be the key that through Reginald Worth Hubbell led me to *Additions & Revisions* 5284 (H&G 4031) and unlocked the mystery.

The elder Catherine Hubbell [12/17/1775 - 3/2/1850] in the painting is 375(366), the elder daughter of 117 Capt. Amos Hubbell and his first wife, Catherine Wilson. The *History & Genealogy* states that her father, Capt. Amos [12/3/1746 - 7/2/1801], was involved in the West Indies trade. Late in the Revolutionary War, he commanded a sloop, the *Julius Caesar*, built in 1782. On February 22, 1783, he captured a British privateer, the *Three Brothers*, off Stratford Point after the British captain was mortally wounded [Note: See H&G p.111].

Catherine's mother, Catherine Wilson Hubbell, died at age 23 on January 4, 1776, when Catherine was only one week old. On December 2, 1776, Capt. Amos married his second wife, 493(485) Eleanor Hubbell. Eleanor was the daughter of 159 Nathan Hubbell [1727-1801]. Eleanor raised her two step-children, young Wilson and the infant Catherine, and bore him four more children: Amos, Eleanor, Anson, and Charles Benjamin Hubbell. A portrait of 377 Charles Benjamin Hubbell now graces the City Hall in Bridgeport, CT, among the gallery of former mayors.

In January 1796, Catherine followed her father's example and also married a Hubbell. She became the second wife of 514(507) Capt. Ezekiel Hubbell [1768-1834]. Capt. Ezekiel's story fills seven pages in the *History & Genealogy* and rivals the saga of Reginald Worth Hubbell's maternal ancestor, General William J. Worth. [But that's another story! - ed.]

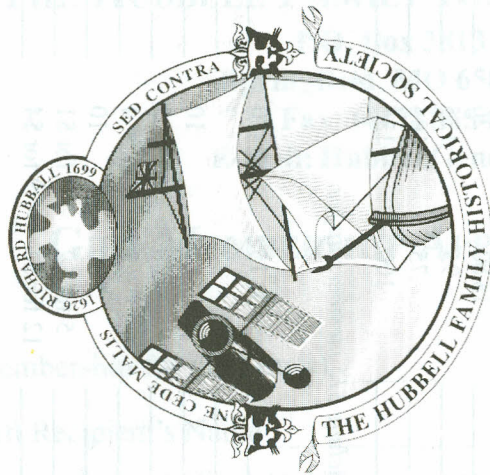

Society members 11730 Ron and Karen Hubbell of Northfield, CT, presented Hubbell Center with a slim leather-bound copy of a book entitled, *Memories 1865 -- 1933*, owned by Lt. Col. Reginald Worth Hubbell [1896-1975]. The typed booklet was written by his mother, Sarah Sprague Hubbell [born 1854]. Sarah was the wife of 2902 Henry Wilson Hubbell, Jr. [1842-1917]

Ron and Karen were successful bidders for this book at an auction a few years ago, apparently the estate of Col. Reginald Hubbell; many military items were listed and both the Smithsonian and Sotheby's bid for selected items.

Sarah's maternal grandfather Gen. William Jenkins Worth had given his name to Fort Worth, Texas, plus Lake Worth as well as Worth Avenue in Palm Beach in Florida. He is little-known in history books since he died before the Civil War. Sarah gives her grandfather's remarkable career in brief and concise language.

She mentions in the book that her paternal Sprague grandfather became the highest ranking medical officer in the U.S. Army. The account of her mother, a baby at West Point, being kissed by General Lafayette is a wonderful family story. General Lafayette's 19th century ceremonial return to the United States is well documented in all the papers of the period [1825].

The conflicted account of her father, Col. John T. Sprague, speaks of his service in the U.S. Army, then he apparently joined the Confederacy and was made an early prisoner of war. In an unexplained manner, he then served the cause of the Union, if not during the conflict, then as military governor of Florida. His records should be readily available and able to resolve the gaps of memory or understanding of his daughter, who was only seven at the end of the war.

Sarah's recollections of her engagement to "handsome Henry Hubbell" and of meeting his family in New York City are most entertaining.

Ron and Karen Hubbell donated the book to Hubbell Center at the 2001 Biennial in Kenai, Alaska, which was gratefully accepted by the Center's Harvey Hubbell IV.

Ezekiel and Catherine's second son was 1342(1261) Henry Wilson Hubbell [1805-1866]. Little granddaughter 2901(2470) C/Katherine Jane [the inscription by brother Henry Wilson Hubbell, Jr. on the back of the photo of the painting depicts "Katherine"] was born July 19, 1838 to Henry, Sr. and Jane Maria (Bostwick). Katherine married Joseph B. Cumming of Augusta, Georgia, in 1860. The painting of Katherine Jane and her grandmother Catherine was in the Cumming home in Augusta in 1908.

Katherine Jane's brother 2902(2471) Brig. Gen. Henry Wilson Hubbell, Jr. presented this photograph to his son, 5284(4031) Reginald Worth Hubbell; the picture showing Reginald's aunt and great-grandmother. It is likely this photo was offered at the same auction that provided the book *Memories* to Ron and Karen Hubbell, written by Reginald's mother Sarah Sprague Hubbell.

What do they say, "If pictures could talk?" Well, they do talk to family better than they would to the Smithsonian.

Memories of Maureen

It was when school started at Newport Harbor High in the fall of 1935 that fate brought Maureen and me together there. I was born and lived in Pasadena until the Great Depression destroyed my father's business. All that he was able to salvage was a house on Balboa Island into which we moved. That year Maureen was a sophomore and I a junior among only about 400 students. Unbeknownst to me, she almost immediately decided I was the boy for her. She was a great fan of Nelson Eddy and perhaps I would do as a stand-in for a young farm girl. Or was it the nice wavy hair I had then? If it was the latter, she never expressed any disappointment when later the tide went out and left only the beach. At that time my main interest was boats, not girls, and what interest I did have was inclined toward blue-eyed blondes, not brown-eyed brunettes.

My lack of response to her attentions did not dismay Maureen in the least, and through our remaining high school and junior college years, she carefully continued to weave an invisible net of fine thread around me. When I went off to the University of Nevada at Reno for two years, it was as they say, a matter of absence making the heart grow fonder and I began to realize what a jewel she really was and enjoyed the net closing in on me. I decided happy sparkling brown eyes were better than any blue ones and so asked her to marry me. She always said she was surprised, expecting me to wait until after the war, but I always doubted that.

We were married in the dark early days of the war on July 12, 1942. As a boy, I had done a lot of traveling and camping with my parents and hoped I could indoctrinate Maureen into these activities, so we planned our honeymoon as a week of adventure with visits to Bryce, Zion, and Grand Canyons. We took the 14 mile round trip by mule to the bottom of the Grand Canyon and at the end she was so stiff she could hardly get off the mule, but she did so with a big smile and no complaints. She passed the test with flying colors as I was sure she would. Over the years we did everything from backpacking to ballooning and touched on all the seven continents.

During our newlywed days, we once went to see the movie "My Friend Flicka," which a few of you might remember is about a young boy and his horse on a large ranch called "The Goose Bar Ranch" in Idaho. We thought how beautiful the country and how satisfying that country life seemed to be and how we would like to have such a place to raise the family we hoped to have. Of course, finances dictated something smaller for us so we decided to call ours "The Duck Bar Ranch." As the war years progressed, Maureen brought into the world two great little daughters, Marilyn and Carolyn, and was a wonderful mother to them.

In 1948, we bought land in the north Tustin area and our "Duck Bar Ranch" soon began to become a reality. We built the house together, Maureen doing the painting and I the building, often with her help. Another fine little baby girl, Vivienne joined us during this period.

Maureen's community service and social life really blossomed when finally all the girls were in school. She joined and helped manage many many organizations: Church, Girl Scouts, 4-H, Ebell Club, Daughters of the American Revolution, The Freedom Foundation, and many more. She wanted to be involved in everything and I must have heard her say "I would be happy to" a thousand times when someone would call to ask her to "volunteer" for something. I used to kid her by saying, "If you heard someone say they were going to light a match at 17th and Main tonight, you would have to be there to make sure it lit!"

I am so glad Maureen persevered in capturing me. She was the greatest wife a man could ever have. We knew each other for 65 years, 59 of them married. She was always proud of the farming heritage in her father's family, and she so loved her roses and her garden and the Duck Bar Ranch that we are sending along a littlepouch of soil in her pocket so she can start a new garden in her new home. Four of her father's siblings lived to almost one hundred years and we were all sure she would do the same, so her leaving us so soon has been a tremdous shock to us all. I think she squeezed a hundred years of living into the eighty years she had with us. I hope you will remember those happy sparkling eyes that so captivated me so many years ago.
